Year 1 Assessment

Overall, TIDE members are proud of their accomplishments over the past year! They recognize that they set out with some ambitious goals and made some early progress. That being said, more hard work is needed. Two areas that members are most proud of are the ICSA TIDE Education for Coaches and Student Leaders and the ICSA TIDE Culture and Demographic Report (both are discussed below). Additionally, awareness of TIDE has increased.

While some progress was made in regards to policies, TIDE is hoping to continue working on this over the next year. Community outreach is also an area that TIDE would like to focus on and hopes that after Covid-19, this can be addressed more directly.

Education

ICSA TIDE created an education program targeted towards coaches and student leaders because team culture and attitudes are often set by leadership.

As TIDE started, common feedback brought up how many leaders (coaches and students) did not feel equipped to have discussions around these topics with their teams.

After NEISA found success with their education program which was led by TIDE reps on their own teams, several of those subcommittee members joined forces with other conferences to create something for a larger audience. Many potential topics were narrowed down. There was still too much to cover in one hour, and so three sessions were created.

Several early looks at data from the ICSA TIDE Culture and Demographics Report were used to help connect the material to our small community. However, the best feedback came from example conversations.

The facilitators were impressed with the engagement and happy to see participation from all conferences and 92 teams.

Finally, the education program from NEISA and ICSA have been receiving attention from a couple of athletic conferences. Both programs have been presented to NESCAC and Ivy League administrators who have given overwhelmingly positive feedback about the presentations. There have also been discussions on ways that our groups can work together in the future.

"When ... (ICSA TIDE) started, sailing was assumed to be a predominantly White and privileged sport. These assumptions were further supported by member anecdotes. To validate our assumptions and track future culture and demographic changes within the sport, ICSA TIDE set out to gather data characterizing the population of current college sailors and coaches. While the ICSA TIDE Task Force began its work in June 2020, its principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion are an established part of the ICSA's Procedural Rules as quoted below."

NEISA

We updated our bylaws in Winter 2020-21 and implemented a few more changes, including an anti-discrimination requirement for regatta hosts and some clarification regarding the responsibilities of NEISA TIDE representatives.

We hope that sailors can safely return to the water; that TIDE can assist in the process however we can while also promoting Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

The West Coast group has representation from ten teams, and is starting to take action towards making our conference(s) a better place. We have established two subcommittees focusing on Outreach & Membership and Bylaws. Additionally, we are working closely with community partners and the newly-formed PCCSC TIDE Action Committee.
