Highlights of competition:

Sailed in Lark sloops; winds light to moderate, north-northwesterly on Monday, easterly on Tuesday.

At the conclusion of the round-robin of matches, with each team meeting every other, BU and Navy had identical records of 8 wins and 2 losses, and a sail-off match was necessary to determine the winner. Navy had beaten BU in their earlier encounter during the round robin and held the lead in the deciding match at the first mark, but BU moved into a narrow and vulnerable lead on the two reaches. Rounding the leeward mark in first, fourth, and sixth (to BU's second, third, and fifth) Navy's latter two skippers began to squeeze BU's Drusilla Saur in fifth. In the meantime, BU's Slattery and Burke worked on Navy's Gerard Coleman and eventually dropped him from first to third, while Saur managed to pass both Jasper Craig and John Speer of Navy shortly before the finish. Final match scores: BU first-second-fourth (6 3/4 points)
