

Sailing Instructions for Hoosier Daddy Regatta
Hosted by Indiana University
Date April 6-7, 2019

1. Rules

The Regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the ICSA Procedural Rules, except as any of these are changed by these Sailing Instructions.

2. Entries

Eligible schools will enter the event by listing the names of Registered Contestants to participate for a team on the Record of Participation Forms.

3. Notices to Competitors

Notices to Competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at the Indianapolis Sailing Club.

4. Changes in the Sailing Instructions

Any change in the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0830 on the day it will take effect, except that any changes to the schedule of races will be posted by 1630 on the day before it will take effect. Other changes may be made to expedite the running of the event if Judges approve and all teams are notified before the race in which the change would take effect.

5. Schedule of Races

Saturday Reporting time: 0900
 Skippers meeting: 0930
 First Warning for 1st race: 1000
 Warning for subsequent races will be sounded as soon as possible after a reasonable amount of time is given for the rotation of boats. Starts will not be delayed.

Sunday Reporting time: 0900
 First Warning: 0930
 Warning for subsequent races will be sounded as soon as possible after a reasonable amount of time is given for the rotation of boats. Starts will not be delayed.
 No "A" Division race will start after 1300 or if a MCSA Championship 1500.

6. Personal Flotation

Life Jackets are to be worn by all competitors shore to shore. No exceptions! This changes RRS 40.

7. The Course

The diagrams in Illustration A show the courses, including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

8. Marks

The Start and Finish mark will be a yellow ball. All course marks will be orange tetrahedrons.

9. The Start

- 9.1 Races shall be started with a 4 sound Attention Signal 1 minute before the first Warning Signal. There will be 1 minute between the start of a boat class and the Warning Signal for the following boat class.
- 9.2 The starting line will be between a staff on the Race Committee boat at the starboard end, and the port-end starting mark.
- 9.3 In the case of an On Course Side, the Race Committee will follow ICSA Procedural Rule 18(b)(iv).

10. Change of Course after the Start

10.1 If the Race Committee signals a shortened course, by displaying Code Flag S with two sounds from a support boat, the next leg of the course is the last leg and ends at the Finish Line at the RC Boat. The shortened course shall be signaled as the first boat rounds the mark or passes through the gate beginning the new last leg of the race. Display of the shortened course signal shall be continued, without sounds, as all subsequent boats round the mark or pass through the gate. This changes RRS 32.2.

11. The Finish

The finishing line will be between a staff on a Race Committee boat and the nearby mark at the port end.

12. Penalty System

- 12.1 RRS 44.1 as modified by ICSA Procedural Rule 31 (Alternative Penalties) will be used
- 12.2 PR 32 (Immediate Penalties for Breaking RRS 42) will not be in effect.

13. Protests and Breakdowns:

- 13.1 Competitors intending to protest about an incident that occurred in the racing area shall notify the RC Finish Boat, after finishing and while still in the immediate area of the RC Finish Boat, of their intent to protest including the sail number of the boat(s) being protested. This adds to rule 61.1(a).
- 13.2 Protests and Breakdowns will be written. Standard ICSA forms are available from the host school. Completed forms are to be handed to the scorer when the protesting skipper has more than 30 minutes ashore between races
- 13.3 Protests will be heard in approximately the order of receipt. The protesting parties and all witnesses should be prepared to have their hearings at any time after the protest has been filed and all parties are ashore.

14. Scoring

Scoring will be done as prescribed in ICSA Procedural Rules 23 and 24.

15. Support Boats and Coaching

Communication and contact between competitors and other individuals will be governed by ICSA Procedural Rule 19 (Coaching).

16. Prizes

Prizes will be awarded to teams placing first, second, and third. Other awards may be presented.
