## Notice of Race

The Organizing Authority for the 2014 Central Coast Challenge will be:  
The University of California – Santa Barbara Sailing Team (UCSB),  
The Westmont College Sailing Team (Westmont),  
and the Pacific Coast Collegiate Sailing Conference (PCCSC)



### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by rules as defined in the *2013-2016 Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS), the 2013-2016 Inter-Collegiate Sailing Association (ICSA) Procedural and Class Rules, and by the Sailing Instructions.

### 2. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- 1100 First Warning
- 1530 No Warning Signal after this time

### 3. FORMAT, ELIGIBILITY and ENTRY FEE

- 3.1 The regatta will be a two division event: A & B.
- 3.2 Schools may enter a varsity coed team and a varsity women's team and unlimited JV teams.
- 3.3 Varsity and JV teams will start and be scored together.
- 3.4 There is no entry fee.

### 4. BOATS/SAILS

- 4.1 Boats will be CFJ's. **Limited charter boats will be provided for a fee of \$30 per boat** for the weekend. Boats can be reserved by emailing [ucsbsailingcoach@gmail.com](mailto:ucsbsailingcoach@gmail.com).
- 4.2 Teams are asked to bring their own PCCSC class legal sails. Limited charter sails are available by emailing [ucsbsailingcoach@gmail.com](mailto:ucsbsailingcoach@gmail.com).
- 4.3 Schools that are bringing multiple teams may be asked to tow some boats to the venue as the UCSB & Westmont Sailing Teams only have 12 boats.

### 5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1 Sailing Instructions will be available at registration the day of the regatta.

### 6. RACING AREA / ROTATIONS

- 6.1 The sailing area will be in the Santa Barbara Channel within .5 mile of the harbor entrance.
- 6.2 Divisional rotation area will be announced at the competitor meeting. Rotations will take place approximately every two races but may be verbally changed during the course of the regatta.

### 7. THE COURSE

- 7.1 'Attachment A – Course Chart' will be provided at registration and will describe the marks and courses, including the approximate angle between the legs, the order in which marks are to be rounded or passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 7.2 The number of the course to be sailed will be hailed from the Race Committee boat.

## **8. START/FINISH**

- 8.1 Races will be started in accordance with ICSA Procedural and Class Rules.
- 8.2 The start and finish lines will be between an orange flag on the RC boat(s) and an inflatable mark.

## **9. SAFETY**

- 9.1 Personal floatation devices (type III minimum) must be worn at all times on the water except for a short time to adjust clothing.

## **10. COACHING**

- 10.1 Coaching will be addressed at the competitor meeting.

## **11. HOUSING**

- 11.1 There are several hotels on Cabrillo Blvd. within walking distance of the regatta site. Early reservations are usually necessary. More affordable options are also available in Santa Barbara or Goleta within a 15 minute drive. SBYC recommends that hotel reservations be made as far in advance as possible. - 11.2 STUDENT HOUSING: Contact the team for limited space with students.
- 11.3 CAMPING: Campgrounds are abundant in Santa Barbara and Ventura Counties.

## **12. PARKING**

- 12.1 Parking at the venue is restricted to certain areas as dictated in 'Attachment A – Parking'. Trailers and boats may be left overnight in the harbor parking lot in designated areas if desired.

## **13. DIRECTIONS**

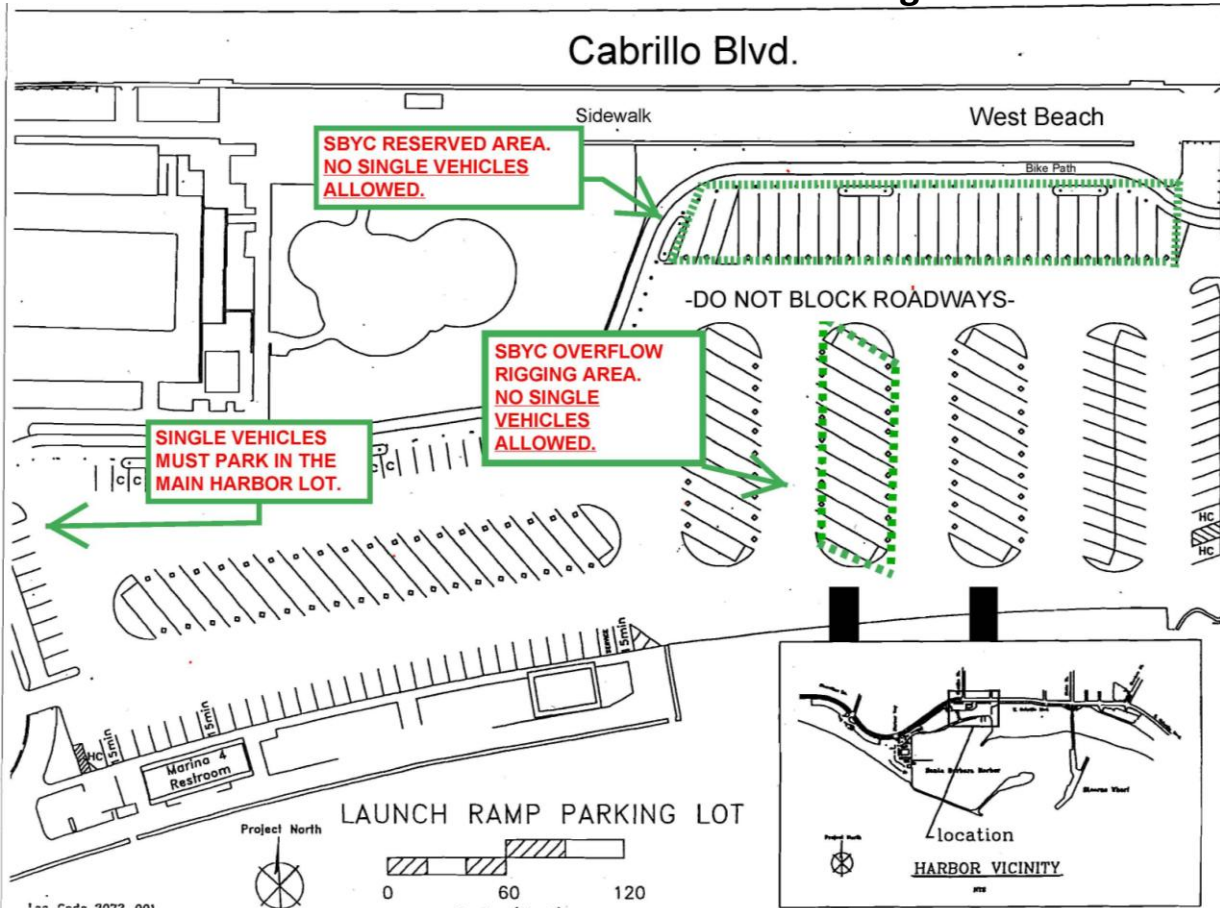
From LA: Take US 101 North to Santa Barbara  
Exit Garden St, Turn Left  
Turn Right onto Cabrillo Blvd  
Turn Left onto Harbor Way  
Bear Left immediately into public parking  
Proceed along the harbor past 2 gates to the Launch Ramp

From SF: Take US 101 South to Santa Barbara  
Exit Castillo St, turn Right, get in the center lane  
Turn Right onto Cabrillo Blvd  
Turn Left onto Harbor Way  
Bear Left immediately into public parking  
Proceed along the harbor past 2 gates to the Launch Ramp

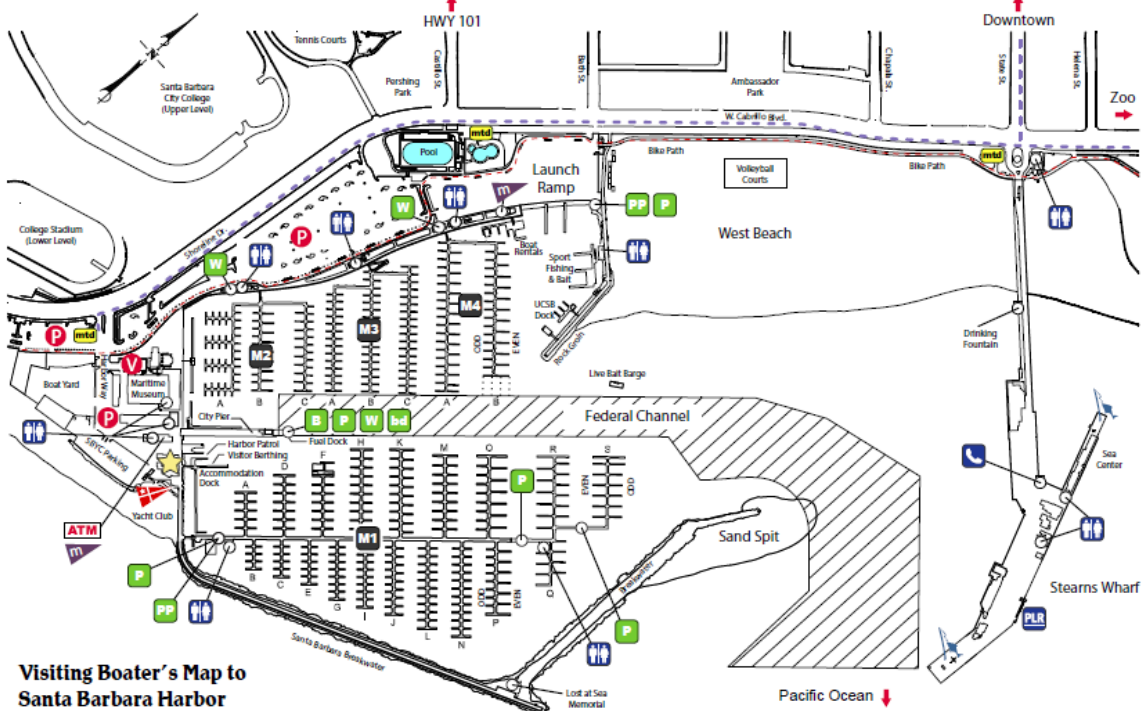

# 'Attachment A – Parking'



- Do not block roadways while coaching, rigging, loading, or unloading, etc. Rig only in designated areas.
- No single vehicles may be parked in the yellow trailer stalls. Trailers and cars with trailers only.
- Please launch from east most ramps only and return dollies to the rigging areas after launching.
